Executive Summary NORTHERN MIDDLE

Mission Statement: The mission, vision, belief, and motto statements were developed or revised and approved by SBDM Council in January 2008. In November 2009, these statements were reviewed by all staff members. Unanimously, they voted for them to remain unchanged. Therefore, no revisions were made. These were developed collaboratively by our students and staff during several team meetings with the leadership team and voted on by the entire staff. MISSION: Paving the future for Responsible and successful students in a safe, nurturing environment Designed for academic excellence for Every child, every day BELIEFS: • We believe education is a joint effort between schools, families, and the community. • We believe all students can learn and be successful. •We believe education is a valuable, important asset for our students and our future. • We believe it is our responsibility to prepare students to be responsible citizens in our changing and diverse society. • We believe children are our future. Needs Assessment: Our teachers and administrators brainstormed focus areas of improvement for their content. The departments reviewed the items and prioritized their focus areas. Dept. chairs met with administrators to review the existing CSIP and amended or abolished the activities. The primary sources of data are the analysis of the Interim KPR and the NCLB Adequate Yearly Progress report. Secondary sources of data included an internal review of the SISI document, teacher survey on Professional Learning Communities, and a Parent Survey. Refer to the Needs Assessment Summary document and the Interim Performance Report Data Analysis tool for detailed findings from each source. According to NCLB, NMS met 12 of the 13 targeted goals. The two objectives that are priority needs are 1). Reading for Students with Disabilities and 2). Math for Students with Disabilities. Although we made safe harbor in math for demonstrating improvement, we did not meet our proficiency target. We also conducted quarterly reviews of the current CSIP, collected on-going data using AIMSWEB througout the year for students in intervention math and reading programs, and data from universal screeners. Other sources of data throughout the year have been learning checks, EXPLORE results, PAM tests, and classroom assessments. We have monitored progress data on targeted special education students and special education teachers have reported to the administrative team regularly. All teachers (except Arts & Humanities) identified targeted students in their content area for Proficiency and have maintained assessment binders to monitor student progress on KCCT like assessments. **Goals:**

Through discussion with state and distrit leaders, we developed the strategies based on the focus for the upcoming years with NCLB and SB1 such as balanced assessment, RTI, and KCAS. Department chairpersons and all teachers had input into the strategies.

Evaluation:

We will conduct quarterly I & I reports as required by our District. We will continually refer to the plan throughout the school year and discuss it periodically as we have team meetings with administrators. A monthly review of the CSIP is also a charge to each content committee from the SBDM Council.

Stakeholders:

The development of the 2011-2012 CSIP involved many stakeholders. All teachers shared in the data analysis, review of existing plan, the development of the goals and strategies, and final review of the plan. The leadership team and department chairs ensured this was an on-going focus throughout the school year.

Priority Need: According to the May 2008-2009 Interim KPR, our school's overall transition index was 90.32 which was an increase of 3.02. According to the NCLB Adequate Yearly Progress Report – 2009, revised December 4, 2009, NMS met 12 out of 13 target goals. Students with disabilities did not meet the annual measurable objective in Reading and made safe harbor in Math. The percentages of students without disabilities scoring P/D in Reading were 73.77% (6th grade), 84.47% (7th grade), and 76.51% (8th grade). In Math, 65.5% (6th grade), 71.23% (7th grade), and 57.89 %(8th grade) scored P/D. The overall academic index in Reading was 97.96 (2.04 from 100) and 90.02 in Math (9.98 from 100). Students identified G/T met proficiency above 100 in Reading and Math at all grade levels.

Goal: By May 2011, 100% of all applicable NCLB subgroups will meet the annual measurable objective in Reading and Math. The goal is 79.6 proficiency target in Reading, and 68.68 proficiency target in Math as measured on the KCCT. To meet proficiency by 2014, the overall transition index will increase 1.936 annually, Reading will increase 0.408 annually, and Math will increase 1.996 as measured on the KCCT.
