Harassment/Discrimination is behavior based on race, color, national origin, age, religion, marital status, political beliefs, sex or disability that is sufficiently severe, pervasive, or objectively offensive that it adversely affects a student's education or creates a hostile or abusive educational environment. Threats that are independent of discrimination should be coded in Infinite Campus as "Threats" Students shall not threaten to cause injury or harm to another person. Threat shall refer to a communication made by any means including but not limited to electronic and/or online methods.

USE/POSSESSION OF DRUGS	DRUG LOOK-A-LIKE -or- POSSESSION/USE/TRANSFER OF DRUG [multiple options in IC - please see definition]	Includes the purchase, possession, attempt to possess, use, being under the influence, selling, or transferring of the following on school property, at any location of a school-sponsored activity, or en route to or from school or a school-sponsored activity: 1) Controlled drug substances and drug paraphernalia; 2) Substances that "look like" a controlled substance. In instances involving look-alike substances, there must be evidence of the student's intent to pass off the item as a controlled substance; or 3) Unauthorized prescription, OTC (over-the-counter), and other abused or controlled substances.
